This is a tightly controlled business. Mayor Bobell stated he is on the fence. There is revenue there but not sure he is wanting the City to jump on this first hand.

A motion was made by Alderman Neaville to adopt the code to not allow the sale of recreational marijuana putting on all restrictions and allow amendments at a later date. Mayor Bobell stated there was no second. Motion fails.
